In addition to enjoying all the great food and the fantastic music,
here are a few more fun things to consider doing
when you are in New Orleans:

Visit Faulkner House Books

Located in the French Quarter townhouse where William Faulkner lived
while he wrote his first novel. Browse through the complete Faulkner
collection - including some first editions. Other works available include
fiction, poetry, biography and local lore - most in hardback. (*Owner Joe
DeSalvo, in addition to being a very knowledgeable bookseller, is also a
lawyer by trade.*)

Take a Stroll Down Julia Street...plus

The 600 block of Julia Street has a collection of thirteen magnificent mid-
19th century townhouses often referred to as Julia Row or the Thirteen
Sisters, but as impressive as they are, architecture isn't the only reason
to pay a visit—this area is a treasure trove of art galleries that are tucked
into many of the restored warehouses and townhouses. One you
particularly don't want to miss is the Contemporary Arts Center (CAC),
located at 900 Camp Street (a block and a half south of Julia) in a
cavernous warehouse space with oodles of gallery room to showcase
local artists - a contemporary art lover's dream.

Tour one of the Cities of the Dead

New Orleans cemeteries are legendary for their above-ground tombs.
Sometimes creepy, but always beautiful. Guide yourself (in the daytime)
or go with a tour guide who knows all the great stories and secrets.

Ride the St. Charles Streetcar

This mobile National Historic Landmark starts its run at Canal Street;
moves through the Garden District; passes Tulane and Loyola
Universities, Audubon Park, and lots of nearby mansions with those
wonderful wraparound porches; and winds up at Palmer Park where the
driver flops the bench seats in the opposite direction, moves to the
controls at the other end of the streetcar and goes back into town. A 90-
minute roundtrip - available 24 hours a day and costs \$1 each way. The
best place to hop on is at Canal or Carondelet Streets.

Go Browsing at the French Market

A great place for finding presents - lots of different things
to look at - from the sublime to the ridiculous.
Be sure to have some cash with you and if you're serious about your
shopping, be prepared to haggle with the vendors.
